Community Message by Sharon Beals, Chief Executive Officer

Each year for this section of the annual report, I write about the changes that have occurred at Tuscola Behavioral Health Systems during the fiscal year. This year however, I am writing about changes that could occur during fiscal year 17 based on proposed language in the Governor's budget.

In January 2016, Governor Snyder released his proposed FY 17 budget proposal (effective on October 1, 2016). Section 298 of the Governor's proposed budget contains language that would move the Medicaid funds that currently go to the Prepaid Inpatient

Health Plans (which is Mid State Health Network for Tuscola County) and transfer these funds to the Medicaid Health Plans (MHPs) by September 30, 2017. This proposed language has been met with significant opposition by individuals served by the community mental health system, parents, guardians, advocates, and other community services providers. This proposed language is seen as a significant threat to the community mental health system in Michigan.

Based on the strong opposition to section 298, Lieutenant Governor Calley assembled a workgroup consisting of public mental health organizations, counties and advocacy groups to develop a proposal for the future of integrated behavioral and physical health services for the state of Michigan. Both the House and the Senate have proposed alternative language to replace the original section 298 language. For anyone that advocated on behalf of the community mental health system in Michigan, THANK YOU. The workgroup and the proposed changes to the budget language are both a result of the strong advocacy efforts against section 298. Going forward, we will continue to monitor the progress of this workgroup and progress of replacement language in both the House and the Senate.

We look forward to better integration of behavioral health and physical health services within Tuscola county and a stronger focus on the integration of these services.




